Forklift License Ontario - Within North America, acquiring forklift certification or a forklift license involves classroom and hands-on training. Regulatory control over licensing, certification and training for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of state, provincial and federal groups. Operators could get a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. In any case, regulatory requirements have to be met. Recertification is necessary every two to three years.

The forklift is a powered industrial equipment which is designed with many alternatives, like for example sit-down and stand-up models, propane and electric versions, and different types and sizes to meet the industrial needs of workers. Operator training programs are usually individualized in order to deal with the certain uses and kinds for which the operator is training. Training on a sit-down, gas-powered lift truck in a warehouse surroundings will not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered lift truck in a shipyard. The variety of lift trucks and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all businesses and machines. Regulatory standards, hence, tend not to concentrate on particular course requirements but instead on the outcome of individual training courses.

On the job training which is offered by the employer is the most common method of forklift training certification and licensing. The employer who provides this method of certification is needed to offer classroom sessions and practical training on machines at their place of work. Employers could choose to train personnel on each and every kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all machines combined. The course incorporates lift truck operation methods, lift truck maintenance, safety procedures and company regulations. Subject matters particular to the worksite, such as hazardous conditions or materials, should be included. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely use and operate each and every type of forklift on the worksite.

When using a third party trainer, the certification process will normally consist of an on-site component along with hands-on practice.

It should be noted that certifications provided by an employer do not transfer from one employer to the next. Acquiring a forklift license through employer-provided training enables the operator to run a forklift for that particular employer only.

Forklift safety would always be an essential aspect of the lift truck license training, though the specifics of the safety training will be dependent upon the equipment being used. Some safety problems will vary for each employer and industry. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers may have to deal with additional requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, like for instance in marine and offshore uses.
